### **Aboriginal Legal Services**

Aboriginal Court workers explain legal rights and obligations to their clients. They assist in securing legal counsel, finding interpreters if they are needed, assist with pre-sentence reports, bail hearings and referrals. A diversion program for youth is also available to youth with matters currently before the courts.

To assist schools, children and their families in identifying and helping to remove obstacles which interfere with their ability to benefit from educational experiences. Court involvement helps to encourage regular school attendance for those students of mandatory school age by enforcement of the Education Act.

Court Liaison workers provide probation intake services to all youth who receive probation, community service work or where a pre-sentence report has been ordered. They also provide intake for diversion programs such as extra-judicial sanctions or youth justice committees. Court liaison workers monitor the youth courts to keep probation officers informed about their client's appearances.

The Youth Mental Health Court Worker (YMHCW) provides referral sources to the youth justice court for transitional aged youth 16 and 17 with serious mental health issues who are in conflict with the law. The YMHCW establishes contact with community-based services to divert the young person out of the criminal justice system to mental health resources and services within the community.

PYCIS assists clients, their families and counsel in developing community-based options for young persons in the criminal justice system aged 12-17. By providing links to community resources and referrals to services for youth, PYCIS can decrease the number of youth going through the court process by expanding potential for diversion; increasing opportunities for release at bail hearings; and reducing the over-reliance on custodial sentences as a response to youth crime.

The Probation Court Liaison Officer acts as a resource and liaises for Probation Officers in fulfilling their court duties (ie. enforcement of Court orders, Reviews, monitoring court appearances, etc.). In addition, the Court Liaison Officer acts as a resource for Justices, Crowns, defence counsel, police, court administration, youth service providers at court and the public regarding the Youth Criminal Justice Act and related Ministry policy and procedures.

ACYJP is mandated to assist youth of African decent (ages 12 to 17) who are involved with the criminal justice system. The intent of this program is to offer racially and culturally appropriate services and referrals, as a community-based solution for youth of African decent. Services offered by ACYJP include bail planning; case management; case conferencing; community-based referrals; re-integration planning; extended personal support; heritage counselling and community education.

Peel Children's Aid is mandated to provide protection services to children between 0-16 years and in addition, to children 16-18 years who are subject to a child protection court order. The CAS Court worker provides support services to children who are in the Society's care and/or receiving service from the Society, in addition to those children and families who are at risk of becoming involved with the Society.

The JHS Bail Program is available to youth aged 16 and older charged with a criminal offence, awaiting a bail hearing or a review. There are three major functions of the Bail Program. The first is to identify the availability of a surety for an accused person. The second is to provide verified information about an accused person at their bail proceedings, to assist the court in selecting suitable candidates for bail supervision. Thirdly, to provide supervisory, counseling and referral services for those released from custody who have been directed to be supervised by the Bail Program.
